

Amen.






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Teacher's Profile




How Poongmul Has Influenced My Life

Various species can be transported to different areas from their original habitat. Whether accidentally or on purpose, they have both positive and negative impacts on our lives. Non-native species are usually introduced in an attempt to balance the food chain or for economic purposes. However, some of these species cause unexpected problems like overpopulation or even the extinction of other species. Therefore, we should ban the influx of non-native species because of the health, environmental, and economic problems they could cause.

First of all, non-native species can carry germs or diseases that can cause health problems among native species. According to the article "Invasive Species" published by *The National Wildlife Federation*, approximately 42% of threatened or endangered species are at risk due to invasive spe-

cies. For example, Dutch elm disease spread among trees in America after European elm bark beetles arrived and spread a fatal fungus. Since then, over half of the elm trees have died! For this reason, non-native species shouldn't be brought to a new habitat because of the diseases they could spread.

Additionally, non-native species may become so invasive that there could be a problem with infestation, and this causes environmental problems. As stated in the article "Don't eat nutrias: ministry" from *The Korea Times*, "nutrias, an invasive species in Korea, overpopulated because they did not have predators to tolerate their rapid growth speed, even to the point where they began destroying the food chain" (Kim). The article "Bullfrog Breaks Korea's Ecological System... NIER" from *The Korea Bizwire* states that bullfrogs are another invasive species in Korea, and their large diet of native insects has negatively impacted Korea's original ecosystem (Huh). Because of the deadly damage they could cause, non-native species should not be introduced into new



According to *WTTW News*, "the cost of a long-awaited plan to prevent invasive Asian carp from reaching the Great Lakes has more than doubled to \$778 million," and the money spent on getting rid of them increases as they reproduce rapidly (Ruppenthal). Such unnecessary costs to restore a damaged environment by non-native species can be reduced and prevented if these non-native species are banned.

Sometimes non-native species arrive on accident and can benefit us. However, non-native species' potential to better our environment or society doesn't take away the risk of them becoming invasive and destructive. pean taste because France ruled Vietnam for a long time. Banh mi's bread is similar to the French baguette which makes this Asian bread as deliciously crispy as European bread.



After Snow White ate the poisonous mushroom, she became ugly and she wasn't healthy at all. Snow White got sicker and sicker day after day. The





The Man Who Gave Hope to the Blind, Louis Braille

Did you ever wonder what the world would be like with no lights? To live in almost complete darkness would be very difficult. This situation is similar to the life of blind people who are unable to see or can see very little. Reading, something that many people enjoy to do, was impossible for blind people. However, Louis Braille found a way to allow blind people to enjoy reading. Read on to find out more about the man who gave hope to the blind.

Louis Braille was born in Coupvray, France in 1809. He had three older siblings, two sisters and a brother. From a young age, as soon as he could walk, Louis Braille enjoyed spending time with his father in his workshop.

Unfortunately, when Louis Braille was just three years old, an accident occurred in the workshop. Whilst he was handling a sharp object, it slipped and went through his eye. The wound became infected, and a few years later, the infection spread to his other eye. By the age of five, he was completely blind.

Louis was a smart boy and be-

cause of his intelligence, he was educated at the National Institute of Blind Youth in Paris, one of the first schools for the blind in the world. As Louis grew up, he started to think of ways to improve his life and the life of other blind people. At the age of 15, he invented the braille system.

The braille system, which was invented in the 1800s and is still used today, has made reading possible for the blind. Braille can be seen in our everyday lives. For example, in elevators the buttons also have braille so blind people can know which number to press, and in museums braille is used to describe the relics. Furthermore, it is possible to buy books in braille, even novels such as the Harry Potter series. People may think that braille is very easy to read and write, but it is not. Braille is complex and it feels bumpy to the touch. Reading braille is difficult because the sentences are written close together, so if you lose track whilst reading, it is very difficult to find your spot again.

Louis had many challenges while making the braille system. Since he was blind, using machinery that punched holes could be very dangerous. He needed to be fearless to work with the tools he needed. Alongside other difficulties he may have had, he overcame all those obstacles and was able to achieve what he wished for, a written language for the blind.






